For desert habitats, the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum is the finest regional landscape interpretive center in the world. Jones & Jones prepared a plan for the Museum which has served as a long-term framework for its development.

The plan applies a more comprehensive focus on the natural systems of the entire Sonoran Desert: the *gran desierto* and *pinacate* of lower Colorado, the biomes of the Baja Peninsula and the Sonora Uplands where the Museum is located.

Our design of the Desert Grasslands and the Tropical Deciduous Forest exhibits interprets the fragile balance between native plants, birds, raptors, small mammals, insects, geology, microclimate and human impact.
