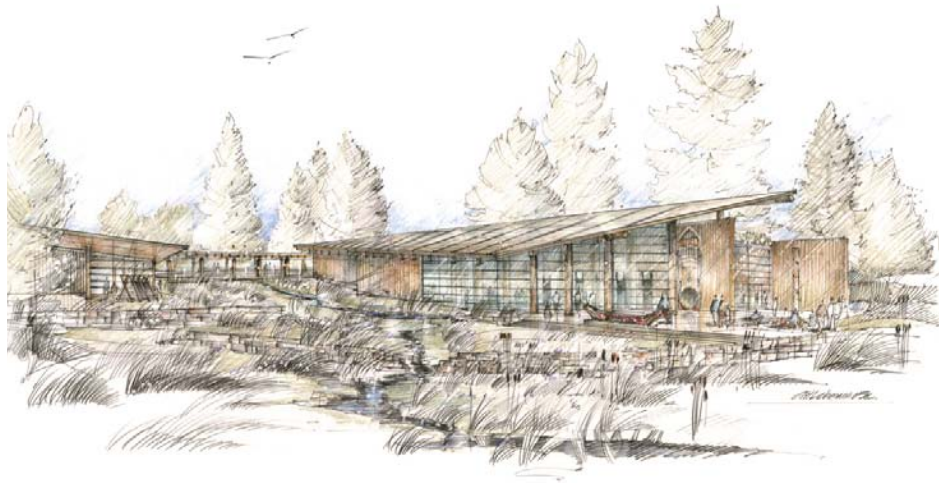
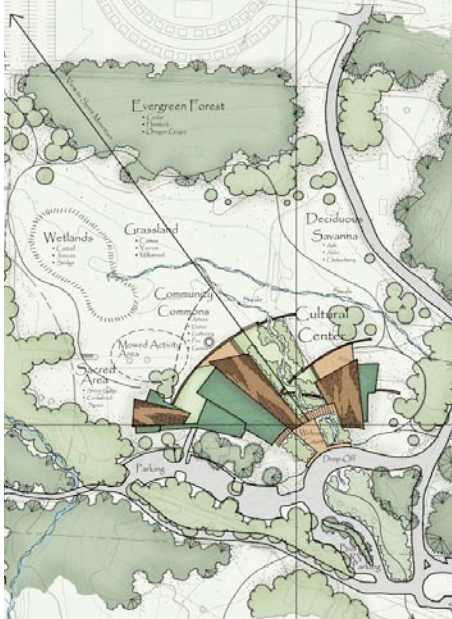




GRAND RONDE MUSEUM AND CULTURAL CENTER MASTER PLAN AND SITE ANALYSIS

The Grand Ronde Museum and Cultural Center will be a place which celebrates the heritage and culture of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde.

Composed of over 20 Western Oregon tribes, the Grand Ronde Community has identified the need for a facility which will “preserve, protect and revitalize the traditions, history and art” of their unique culture. It will provide a forum to assist with a “transition of knowledge,” as tribal elders pass on their culture to younger tribal members.

By strengthening this living history, countless generations of tribal members will forever have a place to honor the past, present and future of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde.
