Located near the mouth of Ketchikan Creek on the site of an ancient Tlingit fishing village, the Southeast Alaska Visitor Information Center is one of four Forest Service-sponsored centers in Alaska focusing on local and regional heritage.

The siting and building design reflect the historical influences of canneries, pitched-roof warehouses, and severe winter climatic conditions. The Visitor Center includes exhibits on Southeast Alaska, the rainforest ecosystem, and a children's discovery area. Visitor support facilities include administrative offices, storage, and building maintenance.
