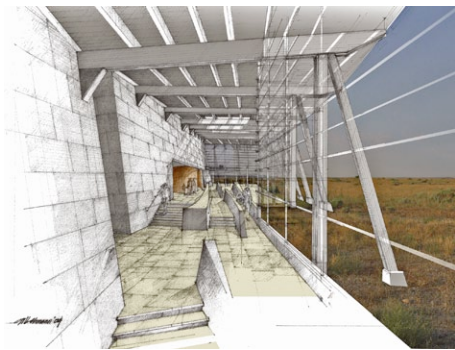
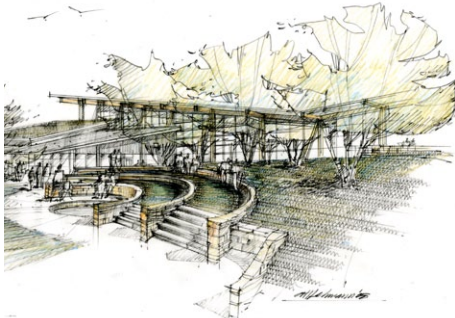




HANFORD REACH INTERPRETIVE CENTER
