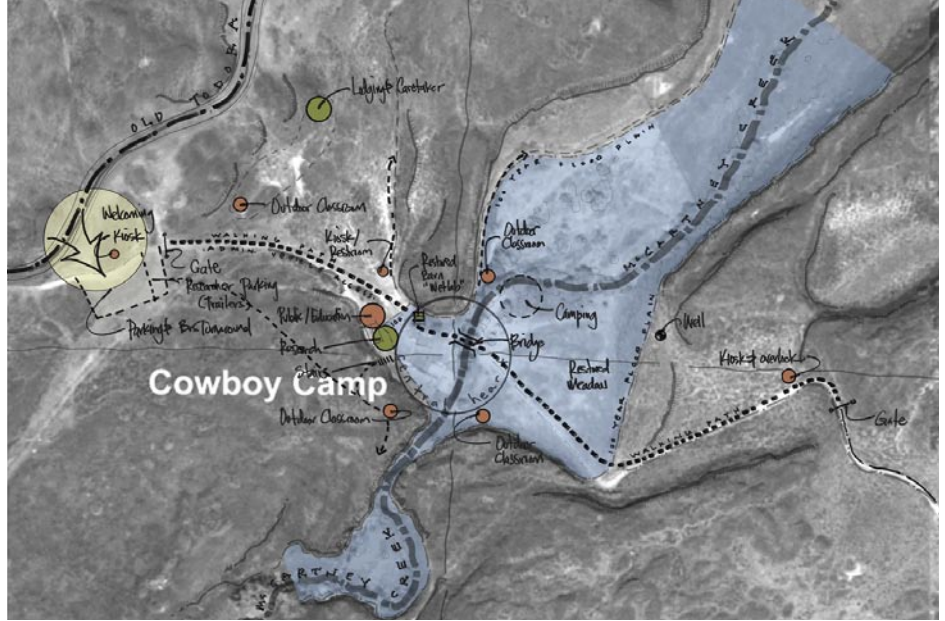




# MCCARTNEY CREEK CONSERVATION CENTER, PROGRAM AND SITE CONCEPT PLAN

## Jones & Jones collaborated with The Nature Conservancy and their regional partners to develop a site concept plan and program for a new conservation center in the McCartney Creek Preserve.

The Center will be devoted to protection and restoration of the shrub-steppe habitat in the spectacular Moses Coulee-Beezley Hills region. It is conceived as a hub for research, interpretive, and visitor programs.

We facilitated a design workshop to help project stakeholders define a shared vision for the Center, including a final site concept and programming plan that provides for lodging, research, and education.

The McCartney Creek Conservation Center will help The Nature Conservancy to engage the regional community in the preservation and enhancement of the fragile shrub-steppe landscape through education, interpretation, and hands-on restoration opportunities.
