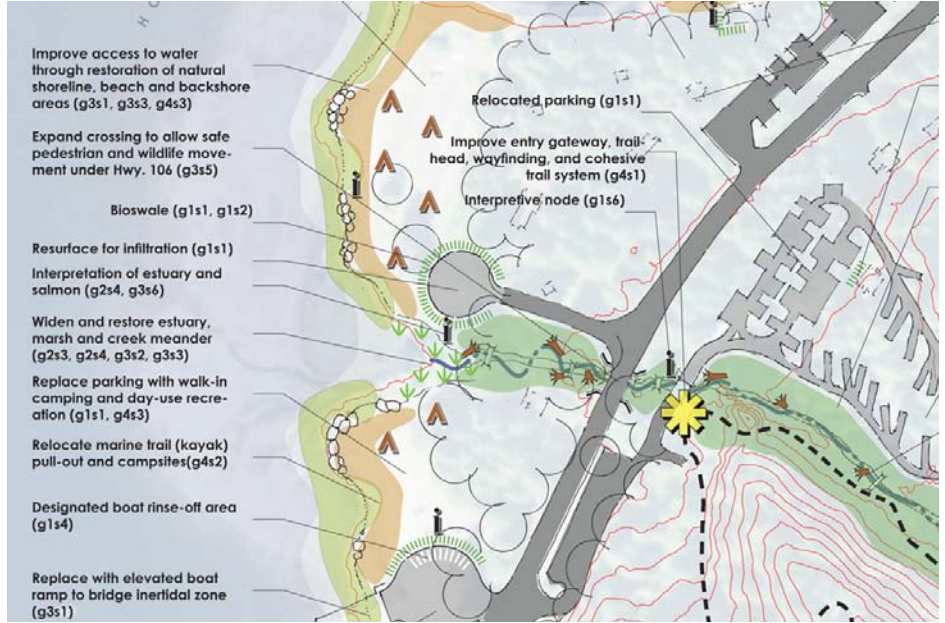
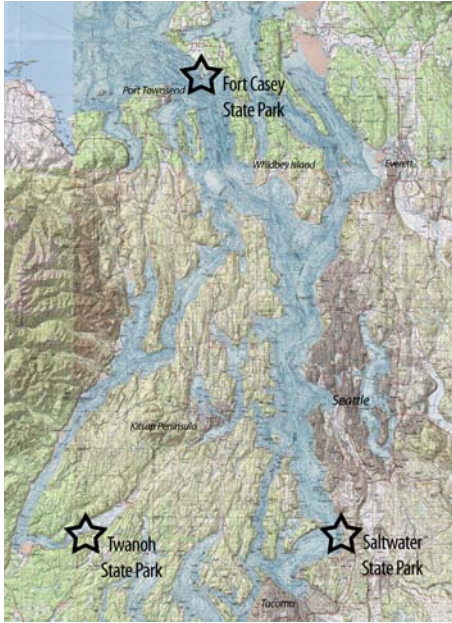

Burgeoning development around the Puget Sound has put a strain on the estuary’s ecosystems and habitats. As part of the Governor’s Puget Sound Initiative, state parks were identified as ideal places to showcase how to care for the Sound.
