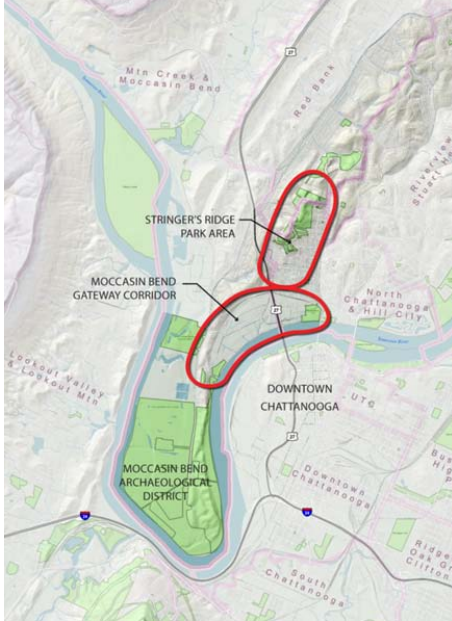




## MOCCASIN BEND AND STRINGER'S RIDGE GATEWAY

Human presence in Chattanooga's North Shore area spans from paleo-indian village sites through the Civil War era to the current industrial, commercial and residential development directly across the Tennessee River from downtown .

Jones & Jones is providing planning and design direction for various activities and elements in the North Shore area. These include continued industrial operations, environmental improvements, multi-modal transportation, interpretation, way-finding, landscape treatment, and overall visual character.

A mile-long corridor parkway consisting of multi-use paths, interpretive sites, river overlooks and small parks will connect people to the historical and cultural treasures of Moccasin Bend district. Connections to Stringer's Ridge, a 100-acre woodland preserve, will consist of complete "green" streets, multi-use paths, and greenbelt areas, transforming the North Shore into an urban environment within a system of parks, open spaces, greenways and blueways.
