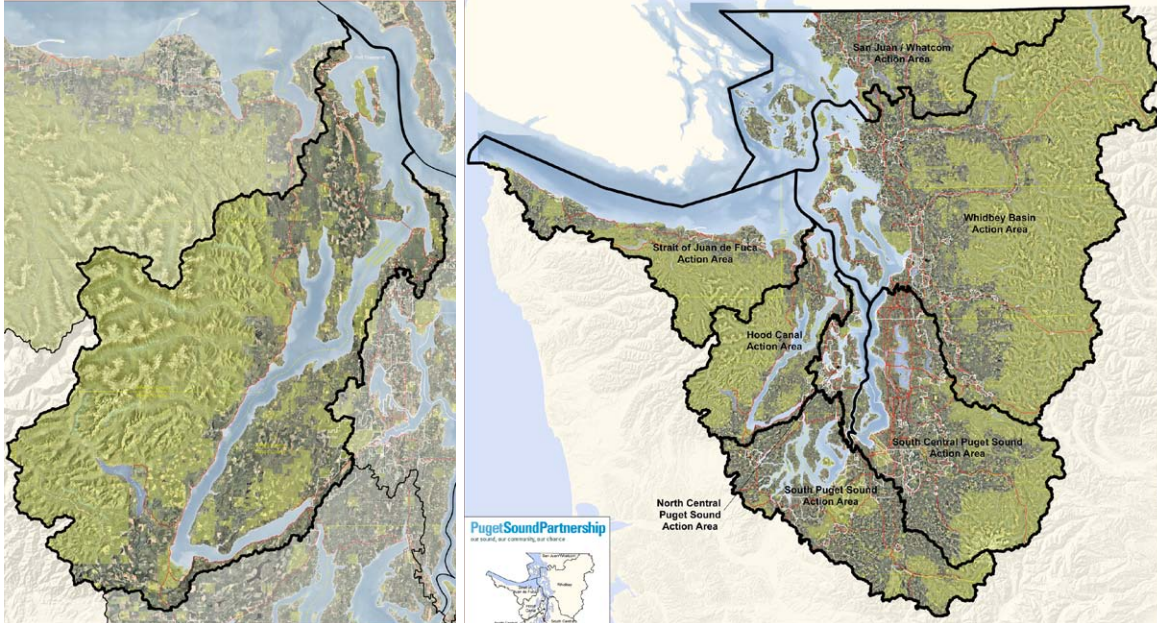

The Puget Sound Partnership engaged elected and public officials, tribal and business leaders, scientists, environmentalists and citizens to develop an Action Agenda to restore health to the Sound. We helped to shape the Action Agenda by providing watershed-based mapping and analysis, coordination of interdisciplinary teams, and guidance in developing strategies and priorities.

The Action Agenda—completed in late 2008—focused on actions that will have the greatest impact on ecosystem recovery. The Action Agenda coordinates federal, state, local, tribal and private resources, and will hold people and organizations accountable for results.
